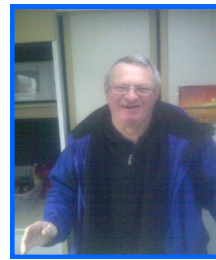


Please pray for them all as they prepare to uproot and start again afresh in a new environment.
